

# Week 1: The Place Where Love Grows



**Read** Isaiah 11:1-10



The branch of hope springing forth in Jesus, would become a crown of thorns, a rugged cross—and a bridge, for us.  
*How did Jesus become a bridge for us to be reunited with God?*

Jesus didn't come for only some of us, he came for us all—your grumpy cousin, your hard-to-get-along-with mother, your Muslim neighbour, etc. If the wolf will live with the lamb, and there will be peace (v6), *who in your life needs to know that God loves them? Who needs to hear the story of hope that sprang from a hopeless place?*

*When has God brought about hope, or a promise of hope, in a 'stump' of a situation in your life?*

Jesus restored peace between us and God by sacrificing himself. "Can I have peace with my grumpy cousin, my hard-to-get-along-with mother, or my Muslim neighbour?" In Jesus, there won't be a difference between Jew or Gentile—my neighbour or myself (Galatians 3:28).

*What are you going to do to allow a branch of hope and peace to spring forth from the stumps in your life?*

*In what ways can you offer help and peace to people, and begin to bridge them to the love of God?*
